- Students will bring completed CRW, with a parent signature, to scheduled meeting with counselor (1/25-2/3)

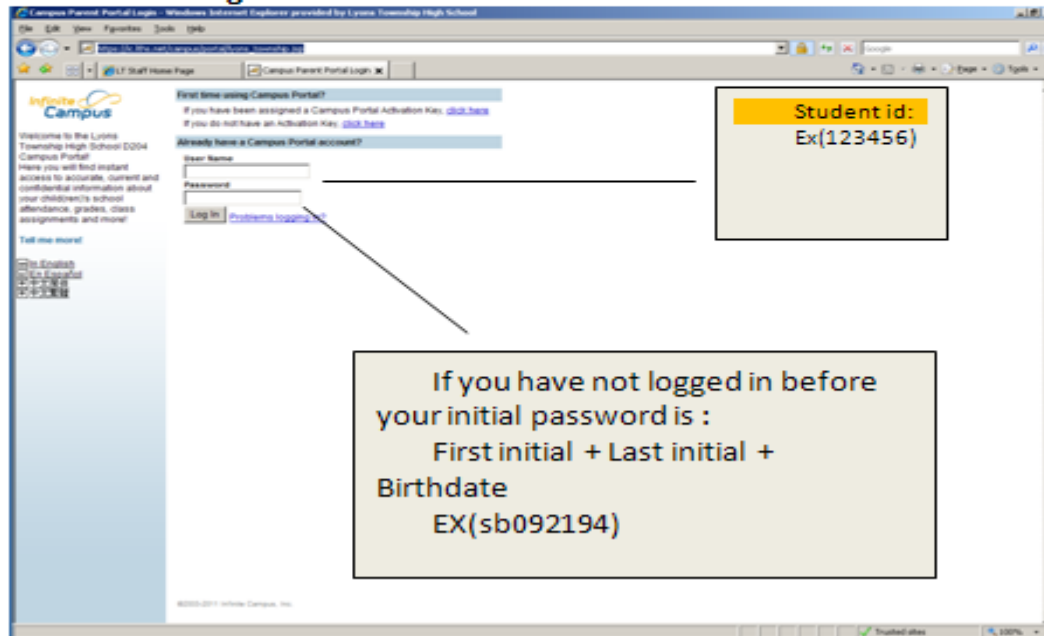


Below is an image of what the screen should look like:

- **1 Credit English**

 - Scheduled back to back periods in classroom with moveable walls
 - Can **ONLY** be taken Prep or Accel level block
 - Can not take two different levels
 - Not available in ELL and AP

JUNIOR YEAR MATH SEQUENCE

- 3 Math Credits needed for graduation
- Must pass 2 credits Algebra & 1 credit Geometry
- See APG pg. 109 for course sequence
- Discuss Level with teacher
- If taking staggered math course pay close attention to course # and discuss with counselor

FOREIGN LANGUAGE

- Not required for graduation from LT
- College Admission Requirements
 - Check intended colleges admission requirements
 - Foreign Language requirements are colleges/universities specific
- Some colleges/universities require
 - 2yrs of SAME Foreign Language, OR
 - 2 yrs of fine arts, music, theatre, OR
 - 2 yrs combination of Fine Arts, Language Arts, and/or Foreign Language



FOREIGN LANGUAGE CONT.

Example:

2011/2012 Foreign Language Admission req.:*

- **University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign**
 - 2 Yrs. of ONE Foreign Language REQUIRED, 4 years RECOMMENDED
- **Illinois State University**
 - 2 Years of ONE Foreign Language required OR
 - 2 Years of fine arts required
- **Eastern Illinois University**
 - No Foreign Language requirement for admission. 1 year of foreign language required for graduation can be satisfied by 2 years of same foreign language in HS with “C” or better.

*admission only. Graduation within specific programs may require additional coursework. Please check college admission and graduation requirements posted on their website as they may be different.
