DRS (Department of Rehabilitation Services)	"Works in partnership with people with disabilities and their families to assist them in making informed choices to achieve full community participation through employment, education, and independent living opportunities." PUNS (Prioritization for Urgency of Need for Services)	"To receive services in the state of Illinois, individuals who have developmental disabilities must be enrolled in the PUNS database.  Coordinators at Suburban Access can assist with enrollment."  Suburban Access, www.subacc.org
Home-based Waiver	"For children and young adults with developmental disabilities who live at home with their families and are at risk of placement in an Intermediate Care Facility for persons with Developmental Disabilities (ICF/DD)."  Illinois Department of Human Services, www.dhs.state.il.us
Home Services	"For children and young adults with developmental disabilities who live at home with their families, require nursing care, and are at risk of placement in a nursing home."  Illinois Department of Human Services, www.dhs.state.il.us
Medicaid	Pays for medical services for individuals with low income. www.dhs.state.il.us
Medicare	"Provides health insurance to younger individuals with disabilities."  Illinois Department of Human Services, www.dhs.state.il.us
SSI (Supplemental Security Income)	"Supplemental Security Income pays benefits based on financial need." Social Security Administration, www.ssa.gov/disability
SSDI (Social Security Disability Insurance)	"Social Security Disability Insurance pays benefits to you and certain members of your family if you are "insured," meaning that you worked long enough and paid Social Security taxes."  Social Security Administration, www.ssa.gov/disability

Respite Programs	Care provided to a child/adult with a disability in order to give temporary relief to family caregivers who are caring for them.  National Respite Network, www.archrespite.org
