

NCAA CHECKLIST
FOR
COLLEGE BOUND ATHLETES

- Register with the NCAA Eligibility Center at the beginning of your junior year at ncaaclearinghouse.net.
- Complete the amateurism questionnaire.
- Print out Transcript Release Form.
- Take your Transcript Release Form to your high school guidance counselor at the end of your junior year and request to have your transcript sent to the eligibility center.
- Take the ACT or SAT and use the code "9999" to have your official scores sent directly to the eligibility center.
- Check with your guidance counselor to make sure you are on track to graduate on time with your class and have the required amount of core classes.
- Sign the 10.1 statement during your senior year to request final amateurism certification (after April 1 for students enrolling in the fall semester; and after October 1 for students enrolling in the winter/spring semester).
- Have your high school submit your final transcript with proof of graduation.

NCAA AMATEURISM RED FLAGS

A STUDENT-ATHLETE WILL LOSE HIS/HER ELIGIBILITY IF:

- He or she agrees to be represented by an agent
- He or she accepts any benefits from an agent
- His or her advisor markets his or her athletics ability or reputation to a professional team
- Uses a recruiting service- make sure he or she pays only a flat fee
- Tries out, practices, or competes with a professional team
- Signs a contract with a professional team or
- Plays with a professional team
